Dear Dr. Keen,

Finally my son Jack was admitted to Medicine. It has been a great relief, after a year of worries and anxieties. Dr. Khuri worked hard for him and his grades were pretty good. He had 84.35 yearly average in Senior.

I think it is Dean Asper's policy to take more and more students from Senior (therefore less and less from Junior), so that eventually all students will be admitted from Senior, as they do in the states.

Yesterday morning I was passing from Boris Hamoud. I dropped in to see Mr. Garabed Haroutunian. ~~There~~ there was another family in the house. They told me that after the death of his wife some month ago, he now lives with his mother-in-law. I found the place. I asked him about the translation. He hasn't done much. I am pessimistic. Last year he was in better shape, but now he looked tired, depressed and older. I think he is too old and sluggish for the job.

TIME had reviewed Arlen's "Passage to Ararat" in its Aug. 18-th issue. "Passage to Ararat" has been published now in book form. According to TIME, it has been a "Best Seller No. 1" during July. "Astag" had bought the right to translate and publish the articles in Armenian and it has been doing so. It will also publish the Armenian translation in book form.

Tuition fees of A.U.B. have been increased from 15-40%. Fees for Medicine I is now 4300 L.L.B. Last year I got scholarships for Jack from Gulbenkian, A.B.B.U. and some from A.U.B. I hope we will manage also this year.
